Project Update: February 2013

The research and survey work started in August 2012. As the study area has three Wildlife Sanctuaries, we have to pass through the process of taking permission for survey and other official procedures for initial 2 months. Our actual field work has started after monsoon, when the forests are easy to approach. We have collected the secondary information of human-bear interaction in the study area, past records of sloth bear presence and dividing the study area in to $5 \times 5 \text{ km}^2$ grids as per the previous work. We have surveyed almost 40% of the study area for bear signs and have interviewed the bear victims. The table below summarises the progress of the work and sloth bear signs we recorded in the study area.


