Project Update: August 2013

We successfully conducted a survey in Central Armenia in from 2^{nd} to 30^{th} August 2013. We visited the following areas and counted wild goats: Khosrov branch of Khosrov NR (the only state-protected wildlife area during the whole trip) – 54 goats; Ardoikar cliffs, Soyanots and Ekhegis Gorge – 166 goats and a bear; Noravank Canyon – 106 goats; Bargushat Range – 49 goats; Nuvadi (Nrnadzor) Village – 133 goats; and finally Ak-Kilisa Valley – 19 goats. For the first time we found old males on low elevations in summer in Khosrov.

We witnessed further increase in Ardoikar which we had visited in the summers of 2010 and 2012. All these areas are also interesting as boasting lots of historical medieval monuments (see photos by Alexander Malkhasyan, except otherwise stated).
