Project Update: September 2012

After 4 months of intensive camera-trapping and transect-sampling we have achieved the following:

- 1. We have identified seven jaguars, including three females and four males. One of the females was photographed at Aguas Frías Sector, which represents the first photo of a jaguar ever taken in the mountain sector of the Tortuguero National Park. The other jaguars were reported on the straight of the beach.
- 2. We have been able to identify 15 prey species.
- 3. In July 2012, we initiated the dissemination activities with the support of Panthera-Costa Rica and Global Vision International. So far we have given three presentations to the communities of Barra de Tortuguero and Parismina, and on September we conducted a workshop for the park rangers about "Non-invasive Methods to Study Jaguars".
