## Project Update: February 2011

Two Focused Group Discussions (FGD) were arranged within the local community people to assess their perception in co-management. One female and one male group, each consisting of six members, participated in the FGD.

The outcome of the FGDs can be summarised as follows:

## Community views on biodiversity and co-management

- 1. Have primary idea about the importance of conservation (NSP played a significant role in this regard).
- 2. Protected areas (its resources) are important for their livelihood.
- 3. Illegal harvesting and felling from wildlife sanctuary reduced significantly. NSP and IPAC project played a substantial role in this regard.
- 4. Co-management helped to increase awareness apart from creating a joint responsibility to prevent unwanted activities/illegal felling
- 5. Women members involved in the programme are trying to divert /reduce their dependency on PA through AIG (Alternative Income Generation).
- 6. More confident about programme benefit due to the legalisation of the participation through GO (Government Order).
- 7. Community people felt empowered through the project. They are now invited by the local forest authority during various stages of co-management programme which deemed absent in conventional management system of the forest department.

## Weakness/Drawbacks encountered by the community people

- 1. Less inputs (i.e. training, finance and marketing support) towards AIG.
- 2. Still influenced by local elites in different management activities i.e. beneficiary selection for plantation, training, AIG support and others.
- 3. Protected Area (Chunati Wildlife Sanctuary) (PA) is almost barren due to massive exploitation.
- 4. Number of forest resource users (FUG) are more compared to available initial support provided by the programme/project.
- 5. Community people who are directly involved in the project are positive towards the co-management concept while others have mixed opinion.
- 6. Local forestry officials are reluctant or less enthusiastic in promoting comanagement concept and its implementation.
