Project Update: September 2016

The IUCN experts re-estimated the conservation status of the species and confirmed it as Vulnerable. The experts used data from our publications that we got during our expedition supported by Rufford Foundation.

It was the main idea of my project - to collect strong arguments about critical situation with *N. lasiopterus*. Thank for the Rufford Foundation for possibility to realise the research in field, and my thanks to Simon for correction my simple English in the last manuscript.

Now I sure than we have achieved the main goal of the first two parts of the project, and I will apply to the Booster Grant.
