Project Update: May 2013

Below are the activities carried out and also find attached representative pictures of the activities.

- 1. Stakeholder identification. Our project received invaluable cooperation and inclusion of the county commissioner (J.M Motari), and the County Chief Warden- Lake Bogoria National Reserve (Mr. William Kimosop) who not only pledged to form a taskforce to oversee the protection of the birds but also to consult with the national government about their support of setting up of a conservation plan for Sawaiti. We have also received immense support from some farmers who are ready to change their activities which are a threat to the wetland into more sustainable practices.
- 2. Identification of possible agro-ecological activities for the protection of Sawaiti. We were able to do a survey with many locals and it was evident that untapped potential exists on promotion of beekeeping which will promote conservation of the swamp.
- 3. Monitoring and survey of biodiversity. We continued with monitoring of the birds and vegetation. We noted an increase on the population which is attributed to the annual migration and change of weather.
