I attended with two colleagues from the Universidad San Francisco de Quito, Maximilian Hirschfeld and Javier Oña. The three of us received our Master's degrees together from the USFQ and each of us has been a recipient of a Rufford Small Grant.



I presented a talk on my research and

conservation work in the Galapagos, and also presented a poster on the Rufford-sponsored work I did in Ecuador to incorporate coastal oceanography into the planning and



management of new marine reserves. We met with grant recipients from all over the continent and learned a great deal about the different ways in which people are integrating socioeconomic development, empirical science, and communication on multiple scales to achieve real conservation targets. We also did a workshop to engage each other in a regional conservation network that we continue to build.
