

## Project Update: November 2013

We have been able to sensitise the community the importance of piggery in biodiversity conservation. Helped farmers to form groups, trained contact farmer whom their fellow group members had selected so as to go and train them in turn in their respective groups. We announced that we want to support organised groups with piggery project, 18 groups applied but we solicited only five due to limited resources. A colourful community support with piggery project ceremony was held on 26th November 2013, gave two weaners per group. We partnered with Fauna and Flora International in extending the piggery project to one of the Batwa settlements. Thanks to Uganda Wildlife Authority who worked with us and supported us with means of transport and technical persons in the excises, also government of Uganda, that gave us the local parish chief to work with us from the start up to this time.
