Project Update: July 2014

Due to inclement weather, the planned field work activities were rescheduled for 2 weeks. The project team conducted field studies in Mt. Lovéen by the end of June and beginning of July 2014 in order to determine population size and density of the Mosor rock lizard, habitat characteristics and threatening factors. Data on population parameters and habitat use were successfully collected and will be statistically processed. It was found that the Mosor rock lizard occupies locations exposed to bonfires burning, littering by tourists and local people and legal building within the national park.
