Project Update: April 2015

From January to April 2015, important educational actions, like a practical workshop to educate farmers in the methods of conservation of degraded areas, interchange with tourists groups to show them the results obtained with the actions of the project, videos' presentations at local television, and three geographic excursions with students with the purpose to educate them in good practices of conservation, took effect in the areas.

We continued working on the revitalisation of the degraded areas, including manages actions directly at five farmsteads, that is considers one of the more important project contributions, because we created a farmer's communal brigade to develop soils restoration works at farmsteads not state-owned, favouring the conservation objectives of the protected area.

Also, we continued the works in natural areas, implementing restoration measures at 10 ha affected by the gully erosion.
