establish three permanent plots				We have established three permanent plots and carried out three field studies within the same plots. I have been in contact with the personnel from different conservation organisations so that the plot could be surveyed at least once a year for 9 more years. But I still don't have conformation from any of those organisations.
Training on butterfly survey and monitoring protocols				The training was scheduled for all of the field visits but couldn't complete the training since none of the conservation committees are active nowadays. There are no one in most of the villages since because houses are destroyed by the earthquake.

## 2. Please explain any unforeseen difficulties that arose during the project and how these were tackled (if relevant).

First and most important issue during the project implementation was lack of people's participation. Langtang is one of the hard hit areas by the devastating earthquake back in 2015. There are only few people in the villages and their priority was on reconstruction. Similarly, weather remained another obstacle for the field study. We could not conduct the field study twice due to incessant rain, even though we were in project area.



#### 3. Briefly describe the three most important outcomes of your project.

a) The result of the study is being published in a reputable journal (in press), hopefully, it will be published within a month.

b) We accomplished a study of a mountain system which was not studied before and it will be a baseline for future study.

c) Public awareness (via school education program, focal group discussion, and publication of checklist and pamphlets)

## 4. Briefly describe the involvement of local communities and how they have benefitted from the project (if relevant).

As mentioned earlier local participation was less at community level. But the students' and teachers' involvement in school education programme was encouraging. They learned about climate change and its impact on indication species (they did not know concept of indicator species earlier) and also participated in debate and drawing competition. Further, the checklist and pamphlets will help locals and visitors to know about climate change, and also help to identify the local butterfly species.

#### 5. Are there any plans to continue this work?

Yes, I wish and will try to continue the work. I have been coordinating with local and nation conservation organizations. Further, I am also planning to apply for the small grants (for example for Booster grant in RUFFORD) to continue and expand the similar works in other areas.

#### 6. How do you plan to share the results of your work with others?

The results of my work have been already accepted, as a journal article, in a reputable journal, which I think is the greatest platform to share the results of my study among the scientific communities. Further, I also have planned to go to the study area and to present the results.

We complete the project in 1 year, which is as per our plan.
