

### **Project Update: April 2016**

Thirty five local teachers and environmental and agricultural educators have been trained on community involvement and dissemination of different nature conservation best practices. At the Rufford Centre, these teachers actively participated in discussions and hands-on sessions of installation of the best practices including improved cook stoves, mushroom farming and improved beekeeping. The action plan for educating students and dissemination of best practices within the communities was discussed and trained teachers have proven their commitment towards the project through organising training in their respective schools/communities. The remaining group of 17 teachers is to be trained early April 2016, as the preparations of student trainings in different schools continue.
