## **Project Update: January 2016**

This is just a brief update to you on progress that we have made using the funds donated by the Rufford Foundation towards training 50 rangers in wildlife poisoning crime forensic investigation.

- 1. Tim Snow attended a refresher course on Practical Wildlife Forensic Investigation at the Faculty of Veterinary Science, Onderstepoort Veterinary Institute, University of Pretoria on 19th/20th November 2015. The included post-mortem/necropsy techniques, sampling and wildlife crime scene management.
- 2. Tim attended an Assessors course at the Southern African Wildlife College (a Rufford Foundation recipient) from 7th to 11th December 2015
- 3. Training and demonstration equipment is being collected from previous projects and purchased where necessary.
- 4. Training course notes are being collated for printing and binding.
- 5. Arrangements have been made to train 28 rangers and field rangers at Limpopo National Park Mozambique from 22nd 26th February 2016. This training will be held at Massingir.
- 6. Arrangements are well in progress to train 22 section rangers in Kruger National Park from 29<sup>th</sup> February to 8<sup>th</sup> March 2016. This training will be held at three venues in Kruger Park.
- 7. Photographs and further information will follow as soon as training is underway.

In due course we hope to expand this training to:

- 1. Gonarezhou National Park, Zimbabwe (25 rangers).
- 2. Tete Province, Mozambique (25 rangers).
- 3. Niassa National Park, Mozambique (25 + rangers).
- 4. Luangwa National Park (Zambia, 25 + rangers).
- 5. Bwabwata National Park and Poisoning of Wildlife Action Group (POWAG) Namibia (25 rangers).
