

Project Update: May 2017

The project is ongoing and I have satisfactorily fulfilled some of the objectives. Sixty-seven interviews have been carried out to local people with interesting results that will be useful in the management of this species. In addition, with this information and field visits I have been able to identify a new locality with the presence of this species.

There were some delays with the analysis of the samples in search of the chytrid fungus, but the field samples have already been taken and will be analysed soon. In the same way, the analysis of potential distribution is currently being carried out.

In the next months, I will present some results of the project to officials of the Sistema Nacional de Áreas de Conservación (National System of Conservation Areas). In addition, I am requesting the recording of a reportage on a national news program to increase the scope of project results.
