Project Update: November 2016

The 20-day survey of the study area within Pantabangan-Carranglan watershed revealed at least 50 species of amphibians - 21 species of frogs and 24 species of reptiles, with the possibility of new species. The number of species may still increase pending further identification of some of the frogs and skinks. The survey team was also able to survey 60 transects distributed within the major habitat types in the area, with most of the efforts concentrated on the forested areas. Identification of species and distribution mapping is currently ongoing.
