Project Update: June 2017

In the second half of 2016, studies were carried out to evaluate the forest use by the bare-faced curassow. These campaigns were very successful. The preliminary results of the occupancy models indicated a strong negative effect of the proximity to towns, such that, 6 km away from the populated areas, occupancy values were greater than 0.45. Also, the results showed the negative impact of logging on this species populations and confirmed the association of the species with the gallery forests.



As of January 2017, we began to visit and interview local people about their activities in the forest and hunting activity (due to large precipitations, we are still carrying out this activity).

In June 2017, we began the workshops at a local school and we painted a mural in a local house. During the following months, we will continue to develop the workshops and include more schools.
