Project Update: August 2009

The key outcome of this first phase is the recording of 14 restricted range species (Andropadus montanus, Andropadus tehrolaemus, Phyllastrephus poem's, Cossypha isabellae, Bradypterus bangwaensis, Cisticola discolor, Urolais epichora, Poliolois lopezi, Phylloscopus herberti, Cyanomitra oritis, Lamanus atroflavus, Turaco bannermani, Platysteira laticincta, Ploceus bannermani) and 7 threatened bird species (Ploceus bannermani, Andropadus Montanus, Zoothera princei, Bradypterus bangwacris, Malacontus cruentus, Platysteira laticuicta and Turaco bannermani) were recorded.

A new site for Bannerman's Turaco at "Mbangong forest" with coordinates 32N0612625, UTM0625733 at 1834m altitude was recorded. Wattle Banded-eye was also recorded in Fomenji/Magha area, indicating a new range extension. A total of 133 species of birds were recorded as compared to 97 species recorded in 2004/2005. Bird conservation education activities were conducted in 11 communities.

This project has started the training of 5 community representatives and one ERuDeF staff biologist who will continue with the birds program when this project ends.
