Project Update: March 2010

The key outcomes of the second phase are a record of 6 threatened birds species(*Ploceus bannermani*, Andropadus montanus, Zoothera princei, Bradypterus bangwaensis, Malacontus cruentus and Picarthates oreas) and 15 restricted range species (*Ploceus bannermani*, Andropadus montanus, Zoothera princei, Bradypterus bangwaensis, Malacontus cruentus, Picarthates oreas, Andropadus tephrolaemus, Phyllastrephus poemsis, Cossypha isabellae, Cisticola discolor, Urolais epichora, Poliolois lopezi, Phylloscopus herberti, Cyanomitra oritis, Lamanus atroflavus)

In Ndumbin and Nkandu there was the discovery of a large forest across the Balereck River with (053°33″379′N, 009°52″070′E) which was the home for grey neck Picarthates. This is a new record for the Lebialem area. Nyitebong and Nyi-fuangonkem Hills recorded further new records of threatened birds (e.g. *Zoothera princei*). Nyitebong has the oldest forest habitats untouched for the last 50 years. A botanical inventory is required here. A total of 195 species of birds were recorded.
