February 9, 2010

They were very impressed about the work of our RSG-Project which aims to disseminate the rehabilitation and biodiversity of Mangrove species. February 15, 2010

The reconstruction of our RSG-nursery to become easier to access and make it as good as Mangrove habitat in all season

- 1. Dig the underground water and construct the cement tank to save the mixed water (fresh water mixed with sea water) to use in the summertime for those species who live in the mix water.
- 2. Adjust the landscape that the sea water always reach by making it as a small pond and add more mud for the Mudskipper, Fiddle Crab and etc. for the visitors to watch and learn closely.



3. Construction of the Walkway is nearly finished. It looks great and is able to catch all eyes of the visitors who pass this area to stop and look.

Our living laboratory is one of the high light places in Prapat beach.



February 18th, 2010

The study group of teachers and students from Ban Suk Samran school, Kamphuan subdistrict, Suk Samran district, Ranong province, visited our RSG-Mangrove Terrace at KCLC. The group of 25 also visited our Mangrove Nursery to see a new walkway. They were very excited in our living laboratory before they went to replant the mangrove species in the degraded area at Prapat beach. All of them took the lesson learned with the happiness experience.

February 28th, 2010

The walkway inside our RSG-Mangrove nursery was almost completed except for the slant. We will put the slant to protect the sunlight over the walkway path soon. This walkway will allow our visitors easily access when the sea tide is going up and down.
