

## Project Update: May 2010

6<sup>th</sup> May 2010

The RSG-project conducted a hands-on learning programme for children from Suksamran High School. They learnt to prepare soil, collect seeds and understand the process of seedlings production at our RSG-nursery. This group of 13 students also participated in replanting the mangrove species at Prapas beach.



15<sup>th</sup> May 2010

The members of the Village Bank (Armanah Credit Union of Suksamran) visited our RSG-Mangrove Terrace. This project aims to disseminate knowledge on benefits of biodiverse mangrove habitats and to train local community and other stakeholders to rehabilitate the mangrove.



20<sup>th</sup> May 2010

The RSG-activities continue to increase stakeholders' awareness and improve practices of local community for increasing biodiversity of the natural mangrove habitat and associated species adjacent to Laem Son National Park. There were 15 fishermen and fish traders involved in replanting different mangrove species.

28<sup>th</sup> May 2010

The RSG-project envisages using our RSG-Mangrove Terrace to disseminate knowledge on benefits of biodiverse mangrove habitats and to train not the local community to rehabilitate the mangrove. Twenty political leaders attended.
