Implement a 4-day teacher training on keeping a sustainable environment and biodiversity conservation				The teacher training was developed and delivered in 2017 in collaboration with a team of different organisations including Project Anoulak, Creative Literacy Laos, Stone Lion Puppet Theatre, Project Central, GIZ's Promotion of Climate-related Environmental Education (ProCEEd), National University of Laos Social and Environmental Education and Development (NUoL SEED), Nam Theun Power Company (NTPC) and Happy Nakai, Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment (MONRE) and the Nam Theun 2 Watershed Management and Protection Authority (WMPA)
Produce a teacher training booklet in English and Lao language				We were not able to complete the booklet during this project, but its production is ongoing and will be completed and disseminated next year
Create and disseminate educational resources to remote schools				RUFFORD funding contributed to the production and launch of two books we produced in partnership with writers and illustrators: 'WONDERS OF THE ANNAMITES': two editions were supported by Rufford funds: the English-Lao edition published in Laos in 2017 and the English-Vietnamese edition published in Vietnam in 2017. 'THE SPIRIT OF THE SAOLA': One edition was supported by Rufford funds: the English-Lao edition published in Laos in 2018. The dissemination of these books was possible through the book launches organised for each editions in Laos and Vietnam and through re-sales in



	shops. The dissemination of the books to schools in Nakai-Nam Theun National Protected Area (NNT NPA) was partially achieved in July 2018 through outreach activities. However, in 2019 we will collaborate with partner organisations to establish libraries in each remote school and disseminate our books as well as other books linked to biodiversity and environment conservation.
Production of awareness raising products as prizes and incentives	Products such as t-shirts and bags were manufactured and distributed during the teacher training workshop and used as prizes and incentives

2. Please explain any unforeseen difficulties that arose during the project and how these were tackled (if relevant).

There were no particular difficulties encountered during the project so far, except a delay in some activities:

- Produce a teacher training booklet in English and Lao language (postponed to next year).
- Dissemination of books to remote schools (partially achieved and planned to be completed next year).

These delays were due to the fact that the current administrative organisation of the protected area is in reform. We are actively involved in the new administrative arrangement and will work in collaboration with partners to develop the new Community Outreach Strategy. This strategy will include these activities that were postponed and/or partially completed this year.

3. Briefly describe the three most important outcomes of your project.

1. A 4-day workshop from 20th to 24th February 2017 was held in Nakai with 91 teachers and four District Education Staff participating from each of the 24 schools in NNT NPA, 21 schools of resettled villages outside the protected area and from three schools from Boulapha District. The training curriculum and activities were developed and delivered in collaboration with a team of different organizations including Project Anoulak, Creative Literacy Laos, Stone Lion Puppet Theatre, Project Central, GIZ's Promotion of Climate-related Environmental Education (ProCEEd), National University of Laos Social and Environmental Education and Development (NUoL SEED), Nam Theun Power Company (NTPC) and Happy Nakai, Ministry of Natural Resources and Environment (MONRE) and the Nam Theun 2 Watershed Management and



Protection Authority (WMPA) => Funds from RUFFORD were used to cover cost of transport, training materials including t-shirts and prizes

The workshop included:

- o **Lectures and hands-on activities and games** on the following themes:
 - Sustainable school.
 - Clean water and the environment.
 - Biodiversity.
 - Teaching and curriculum
- o **Group discussions** around different themes. Support was given from the Nakai District Education Office for teachers to be creative and integrate activities and techniques learnt into their regular curricula.
- o A **celebration festival** was held in the centre of the village for all members of the community and local schools to attend. During the festival, all workshop-participating teachers formed six groups to lead their own art activities around a nature/environmental protection theme.
- o A **puppet show** created specifically for this workshop featuring key species from the region was premiered during the workshop and presented to the community during the festival.
- o Participants each received an **animal T-shirt**. Participants were given **prizes** (Project Anoulak bags, books) as incentives during games. Each participant was given a **Certificate of Completion** on the last day. Stationery and other material used during the workshop was left behind to deliver to schools.
- 2. Two book launches in Laos and in Vietnam for the book Wonders of The Annamites:
 - On the 5th May 2017, we organised a book launch in collaboration with France Volontaires and the French Institute in Vientiane for which I gave a public conference, followed by sale of the book => Funds from RUFFORD were used to cover some costs of the event
 - o On the 3rd December 2017, Nha Nam Publishing organised and invited us as well as Eric Losh to participate in the launch of the book, which included a press conference and art activities with children => Funds from RUFFORD were used to support travel costs of book illustrator and translator of the book Spirit of the Saola to attend the event
- 3. A new illustrated fiction storybook 'Spirit of the Saola' finalised and translated in Lao and Vietnamese: => Funds from RUFFORD were used to cover cost of illustration, translation, editing and printing
- 4.
 In 2017, we collaborated with Franco-Vietnamese artist Hoang Van Dao and writer Melody Kemp for an illustrated fiction story about the Saola called 'Spirit of the Saola', targeted at young adults



- The En/Lao edition was completed in 2018 and printed in 1000 copies.
 The book was launched in June 2018 (see below)
- The En/Vietnamese edition will be completed later this year and be published in Vietnam by KIM DONG PUBLISHING VIETNAM
- 5. One book launch in Laos for the book Spirit of the Saola:
 - On 23rd June 2018, we organized a book launch in collaboration with i:Cat Gallery, in Vientiane Laos for the English-Lao edition of the book => Funds from RUFFORD were used to cover costs of the event and to support travel costs of book illustrator and translator to attend the event
- 6. A brand-new website for our project (will be launch in January 2019), which will include an online shop for wider dissemination of our books abroad. => Funds from RUFFORD were used to cover costs new website design and creation
- 4. Briefly describe the involvement of local communities and how they have benefitted from the project (if relevant).

The teacher training workshop that was carried out in February 2017 had a great and impressive turn out of participation of teachers, district staff and youth community from two district of Khammouan Province (see detailed participation in Table 1 below).

We believe that learning by playing and creating can have significant impacts on the learner, especially when teaching complex and important concepts such as environment and biodiversity issues.

With this project we aimed to train teachers and educators to teach children about environmental sustainability practices and biodiversity conservation through art, play, literacy and creativity and then apply these techniques in their classrooms from primary schools to high school students. Techniques and lessons taught aim to increase environmental awareness and stewardship, encourage critical thinking, and develop responsible citizens starting with the youngest in society by actively involving them in the design and implementation of environmental art and green school activities.

The workshop was designed to positively impact local communities, wildlife and ecosystems, build passion and compassion for wildlife and support the development of a group of young educators who are enthusiastic about creating a literacy-rich environment, engaging the next generation in local wildlife conservation and growing biophilia.




Figure 1: Location of villages that were involved in this project (additional villages from Boulapha District also were involved in the project)

In addition, the books we produced have been and will continue to be disseminated to Vietnamese and Lao Nationals for awareness raising.



5. Are there any plans to continue this work?

The project be pursued in 2019.

In 2019, we plan to pursue this project with the following activities:

- 1. Produce, print and disseminate a teacher training booklet in English and Lao language
- 2. Launch the English-Vietnamese edition of 'Spirit of the Saola' in Vietnam (which will be published by KIM DONC PUBLISHING VIETNAM)
- 3. Edit an English-Mandarin edition of the book 'Spirit of the Saola' and launch it in Vietnam and disseminate trough the Chinese community in Vientiane, Laos
- 4. (Re-)Print children's books and disseminate (linked to activities) to schools in and surrounding Nakai-Nam Theun National Protected Area
- 5. Establish permanent libraries in each remote school of Nakai-Nam Theun to distribute our books. Provide training to teachers to manage the libraries
- 6. Train 'Education Ambassadors' from the district of Nakai to support teachers in conservation activities in schools

6. How do you plan to share the results of your work with others?

Via:

- Project reports: we produced a project report after completion of the teacher training, which was wildlife shared to all project partners and supporters.
- We share project stories on social media, on our Facebook page.
- We produce videos that we share with project partners.
- Children's books which we produce and publish are widely distributed and all have a mention about our project.
- Our book launches include public talks and press conferences.

7. Timescale: Over what period was The Rufford Foundation grant used? How does this compare to the anticipated or actual length of the project?

The grant from Rufford Foundation was used from January 2017 to October 2018. The project has to be extended one year to complete productions of the books.






