

## Project Update: March 2018

- The Egyptian Dugong Team (EDT) participated in the event of World Wildlife Day 2018 at El Gezira Sporting Club on March 3<sup>rd</sup> 2018 (<https://www.facebook.com/WWDEGYPT>). I shared my project and PADI specialty course of Dugong Conservation Diver with the participants and the visitors. Our team met with Radhia Achouri – Director of United Nations information Center in Egypt.
- I conducted a presentation about the dugong project in Egypt to 60 students from the New Cairo British International School and the dive guides at Marsa Nakari Diving centre at Marsa Nakari Village in Marsa Alam.
- A total of 100 questionnaires were conducted before and after the dugong watching tour. Most of these trips were performing to Marsa Mobarak from Port Ghalib Harbour. This harbour has more than 30 boats and three glass boats.
- The surface survey was conducted in Marsa Mobarak to assess the tourism activities in the presence of dugong. All sightings recorded were confirmed that the snorkelers and inflatable boats were located less than 10 m from dugongs and the daily boats situated from 10 to 50 m and from 50 to 100 m.
- Four different behavioural categories were recorded for dugong from underwater. Effects of snorkelers and divers was also documented.
- Finally, I received an invitation to be a co-author to write a chapter for Red Sea dugong through a book of the Red Sea that will be published soon by Springer. I acknowledge the Rufford Foundation for supporting the two dugong project in Egypt.
