FieldWork



We did fieldwork from July to September 2017 and did not see many species due to the dry and cold weather of the winter. Some species such as *Rhinella crucifer* and *Boana semilineata* were abundant in all sites visited.

Lectures and presentation of works

Lecture on the life of amphibians for children on September 27, I presented a talk where I explained the life and importance of amphibians to 60 children, aged 9 and 10 years. These children live near Mata das Flores State Park (one of the project study sites) and in this event, I also presented the species of amphibians we found in the park.
