Project Update: May 2019

We have had a delay on the start date. So, we are a bit delayed on the chronogram proposed. However, we have been working hard to complete the project in time.

We are working in collaboration with Costa Rica Wildlife Foundation to increase our scope. This foundation is a well-recognised organisation in Costa Rica that develops conservation initiatives to ensure the prevalence of wildlife and its habitat. With this alliance we will start an invasive species programme to address this environmental problem.
