Project Update: August 2019

During the fieldwork for otters in 2018 and 2019, I was fascinated by the richness of the bird species which were present in the study areas. Wanting to make the most from the grant amount and the survey, I had documented this species richness along with the otter data. This additional data on birds assisted me in preparing and publishing a key paper for the Indian Himalayan State of Uttarakhand entitled, "Avitourism opportunities as a contribution to conservation and rural livelihoods in the Hindu Kush Himalayas - a field perspective" in the Journal of Threatened Taxa.
