The setting of photo traps				Photo traps were set according to the plan. We had a lot of help from the local community setting these cameras at appropriate localities.
Field monitoring				Field monitoring was conducted according to the plan; once every 15 days, over the past year, we visited each of the locations and: (i) searched for signs of wolf presence; and (ii) conducted non-invasive sampling.
Non-invasive sampling				We performed non-invasive sampling continuously whilst in the field. All resulting samples were collected and subsequently refrigerated.
Genetic analyses				Genetic analyses which were undertaken over the previous year are currently in the process of being prepared for publication.
Education				The lectures and workshops organised by the Association of Citizens "C.E.Z.A.R were successful. Also, we participated in: (i) the 27th Rufford Conference in Bar, Montenegro in February, 2018; (ii) LIFE WOLFALPS Final Conference in Trento, Italy in March, 2018; and (iii) the Rufford Small Grants conference (RSG) –"Wildlife Conservation Studies across The Caucasus Region", Kazbegi, Georgia, August, 2018. Also, we initiated the filming of a documentary movie about our projects, funded by the National television station.

2. Please explain any unforeseen difficulties that arose during the project and how these were tackled.

We didn't experience any unforeseen difficulties which may have jeopardised and/or had a negative impact on our project activities.



3. Briefly describe the three most important outcomes of your project.

- a) Immeasurable significance in the continuous acquisition of information on wolf activities, via both new and updated data from existing locations, as detailed in previous projects.
- b) Continuously producing and publishing results on the genetics of wolves from the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina for the first time ever.
- c) Filming of the documentary movie, of vital importance in raising public awareness about the wildlife of Bosnia and Herzegovina. This, together with outcomes from a) and b) will provide all necessary data for the creation of a conservation management plan for wolves in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

4. Briefly describe the involvement of local communities and how they have benefitted from the project.

Local communities are consistently included in our project activities. The volunteers from the local communities help us during the field trips, non-invasive sampling and the collecting of information regarding wolf activities at a specific location. Also, we created a data input project on the iNaturalist citizen science data website in order to obtain additional wolf location data from Bosnia and Herzegovina. The relevant link is listed below:

We have plans to continue this work. We will apply for additional funds from other NGOs. Also, as a result of the experience and information obtained through the projects conducted within the Rufford Foundation, we decided to raise our project to a higher level and to apply new, additional, methods of researching.

We are constantly sharing the results of our work by attending conferences, publishing papers, and via organizing training and workshops.

The grant was used over the period of one year, as was planned. According to the fulfilment of the scheduled objectives, this period was sufficient.
