



Pawalgarh Conservation Reserve

State: Uttarakhand

Total area: 58.25 sq. km

It was notified as a Conservation Reserve in December 2012

The area consists of moist deciduous forest with sub group Moist Shiwalik Sal 3C/C 2a Moist Bhabhar Sal 3C/C 2b (1)

Soil type: Forest and Hill Soil and Gangetic alluvial soil (calcareous)

Rivers: Many small rivulets emerge from the woodland and discharge into small nalahs which finally drain into KOSI and DABKA.

Kosi-Baur corridor: It is an important link for the movement of wildlife.

The Conservation Reserve is home to 19 species of woodpeckers and its allies of the total 34 species found in India.

Woodpeckers कठफोड़वें

hey are chiefly arboreal and are seen climbing up the vertical trunks and lateral branches with the help of their zygodactyl feet (two toes pointing forward and two backward) and powerful tail.

They have powerful bills for (a) boring into wood to extract insects for food and (b) excavate cavities for nesting and roosting.

Food primarily consists of ants, termites, and grubs and pupae of wood-boring beetles.

They can be located with the help of their characteristic loud calls (*aural cues*).

Greater Yellownape (Female juvenile

The intention of this book is to provide an easy to-use guide in the identification of woodpeckers using the photographs for different species as well as each individual (Male and Female). Both common names as well as scientific names have been provided. This booklet covers 12 of the commonly seen woodpecker species.We expect the guide to become an important tool for farmers as well as foresters alike as woodpeckers help prevent us from mass infestation by harmful insects.


