

Project Update: April 2019

In March and April 2019 we travelled along the coast of the state, where the population is more concentrated in large cities. So in some places it was not possible to find a resident near the fragment to carry out the interviews. In this way meetings were marked with managers of the preservation areas belonging to the sugarcane mills, whose plantations occupy the whole region and border the forest fragments. They could indicate the important people to question about fauna and anthropic interventions.
