## Project Update: September 2019

- Between July September, 26 trap chambers were placed at three sites in the yungas. The cameras were left in the field for a month and then removed. Six of the camera traps placed were purchased with money from the Rufford subsidy. Five recorders were also placed.
- During the campaigns, different types of human activity were also recorded at the sites where the trap cameras were placed.
- Currently, photographs of native mammals registered by trap cameras are being identified. We are planning four field trips for the next months. The necessary permits are being made to go to the schools to tell the children of rural schools about the project.
- During August 2019, in the middle of the field campaigns, an outreach activity on native animals of the yungas of Salta and Jujuy was carried out with the rest of the members of the CEBio Foundation in the Faculty of Agricultural Sciences of the National University of Jujuy
