Project update: February 2021

This is the first progress report of an ongoing conservation research project in western Tanzania funded by The Rufford Foundation. The current phase aims to gain an understanding of the drivers of unauthorised behaviour in conservation and identify appropriate interventions. So far, we have conducted 580 household interviews and eight focus group discussions in eight villages close to Ugalla Game Reserve. We are currently doing data entry and preliminary analyses as we continue with fieldwork.
