- The local authority of Khammouane Province has plans to create a new crocodile conservation area.
- Local people of Ka Cham Village as well as forest rangers participated in a training course and the importance of the Siamese crocodile population and its local conservation.

- Local people and forest rangers participated in field surveys with our team.
- They supported us to identify the survey sites and assess the distribution of the Siamese crocodile in the area.
- We explained the importance of the Siamese crocodile to the biodiversity and nature conservation for conducting the field survey.

- Continue to support the local people to monitor in any time.
- The current plans, which are currently in discussion with the Khammouane Provincial Authority, have been designed to create a new reserve instead of extending the Ban Soc Crocodile Conservation Area.

In general, survey days were in accordance with the proposed plan of the project, for the project activities were added more field survey tools as camera traps setting to get the best result, although field work was not conducted in one part, as originally proposed.
