Project Update: April 2022

Here I send you some new updates regarding our camera traps. Specifically, this time I will talk about the two camera traps installed near rescue ramps at water reservoirs.

Unfortunately, one of the cameras was moved by livestock and only could take pictures of some bird species in the vicinity of the water reservoir, as "potential users of the rescue ramp". However, from the other camera, we got very interesting pictures of different individuals (birds and mammals) actually using the rescue ramp in order to safely drink water without falling.

Here is a list of some of the species that we have identified using the rescue ramp:

BIRDS

- Great kiskadee (Pitangus sulphuratus).
- Cattle tyrant (Machetornis rixosa).
- Smooth-billed ani (Crotophaga ani).
- Red-crested cardinal (Paroaria coronata).
- Guira cuckoo (Guira guira).
- Picui ground dove (Columbina picui).
- Glittering-bellied emerald (Chlorostilbon lucidus).
- Southern-crested caracara (Caracara plancus).
- Black vulture (Coragyps atratus).

MAMMALS

- Cougar (Puma concolor).
- Azara´s akodont (Akodon azarae).
