I have presented at two symposium which both focused on the climate change chapter of my thesis.


- SANBI Foundational Biodiversity Sciences where I received the first prize in the students category.
- University of Pretoria Department of Zoology and Entomology.

I have currently submitted an abstract for the International Ornithological Congress which will be hosted in August 2022 – I am awaiting the outcome of the abstract.

Field trip highlights:

- During this trip I was accompanied by two people one was Mr Arrie Klopper who served as a field mentor because of his over 10 years field experience and another was Ms Janine Baxter who served as a field assistant. And also, in one locality, Lucky Ngwenya from BirdLife South Africa served as our bird guide to spot the Botha's lark.
- We managed to capture and sample five Agulhas long-billed larks, which
 was important because there is not even a profile for this bird on the IUCN
 and only two museum samples on the whole country. Therefore, the feathers
 collected will be stored at the SANBI biobank for future projects.
- We also managed to capture three eastern long-billed larks and one large billed lark.
- We managed to see the Botha's lark, however, due to its gentleness with pecking the worm on the spring trap bait, it could not trigger the trap to be captured.
