Project Update: June 2021

Following the planning of our project, a Farmer Field School has been conducted from February to June 2021 in Dassa-Zoumè locality. Participants were trained in seed collection, choice of nursery site, site delimitation and fence installation, seed pretreatment and germination, sowing seeds in pots and aligning pots on a board, seedling watering and seedling planting. A total of 53 people participated in the training.

A training workshop was organised on 12 June 2021 in Dassa-Zoumè locality with the participation of 75 people representing NGOs, nurserymen, and local farmers associations from 10 localities. The workshop started with the welcome speech from the Project Coordinator, Dr E. Bruno Lokonon and the president of the nurserymen of Dassa-Zoumè. The first communication was given by Dr Lokonon and concerned the importance of biodiversity and the threats on natural resources in general and Caesalpinia bonduc in particular. The second presentation given by Mr Moïse Tossou focused on the techniques of production of C. bonduc in nursery. The participants were satisfied with the quality of presentations. Each participant received at least five seedlings of C. bonduc. In total, 1000 seedlings have been distributed. Before closing the workshop, some seedlings were planted by the participants.
