Project Update: December 2022

The actual camera trapping survey was conducted at Kawang Forest Reserve, from 13 September to 17 November 2022. This survey was conducted for 66 days at 10 different sampling points that were established along the trail at this forest reserve. A total of 11 different medium-sized mammal species was sighted at the established sampling points and along the nature trail examined in this research. The recorded species included the long-tailed macaque (Macaca fascicularis), pig-tailed macaque (Macaca nemestrina), Malay civet (Viverra tangalunga), common palm civet (Paradoxurus hermaphroditus), yellow-throated marten (Martes flavigula), long-tailed porcupine (Trichys fasciculata), thick-spined porcupine (Hystrix crassispinis), southern red muntjac (Muntiacus muntjak), Sunda stink badger (Mydaus javanensis), Sunda pangolin (Manis javanica), and mousedeer (Tragulus spp.). The picture of each species captured by the camera traps are attached in this quarter report, alongside with their respective scientific names, common names (English and Malay versions of the local names at Sabah), and IUCN Red List Statuses.
