Project Update: February 2008

We conducted our first field trip on February 2008. The capture effort was 900 night/traps. We sampled two different habitat types to compare mammal's diversity with habitat complexity. One habitat was dominated by the creosote bush Larrea divaricata accompanied by small shrubs, herbs and forbs. The other habitat was less complex and heterogeneous but had higher plant diversity, dominated by small shrubs.

A total of 22 small mammals were captured of two species: Eligmodontia typus and Graomys griseoflavus. E. typus dominates on the small shrubs habitat, and G. griseoflavus was present in less density. On creosote bush habitat, only E. typus was found. We also recorded signs of medium size mammals like Microcavia australis, Dolichotis patagonum and Ctenomys mendocinus.
