Project Update: December 2010

We have now successfully completed data collection from the river mouth of Arno Garno River and its tributaries. An awareness creation workshop was conducted on 29 October 2010 in Maksegnit town, a district town located near Arno Garno River. Relevant stakeholders including fishermen, development agents and experts of the agricultural and environmental offices participated in the workshop. Lectures were given on status of the fish and fisheries of Lake Tana, migratory behaviour of Labeobarbus spp. of Lake Tana and fish and fisheries of Arno Garno River. The last one was a progress report on the data we have, so far, collected from Arno Garno River. There was a lively discussion on all sorts of problems and threats on the fish and fisheries of Lake Tana and Arno Garno River. The prominent ones include fishing during times of migration of Labeobarbus spp., sand excavation from Arno Garno River and smaller tributaries that serve as important breeding grounds for fishes and lack of awareness on the importance (biodiversity and economic) of conservation of the Labeobarbus spp. on the part of fishermen, experts of related fields and decision makers. It was interesting to note that some experts working in the animal sector are not even aware of the migratory behaviour of the Labeobarbus spp. The fishermen presented their problems of having no adequate fishing gears and trainings as well as the issue of illegal fishermen and illegal gear that operates in Lake Tana.
