

## Project Update: May 2011

Right now, there are 16 camera traps working Santa Rosa National Park and Guanacaste (Table 1.). We have had 20 jaguar signs, and six pictures of jaguars (four individuals), and 360 pictures of prey up to May 22nd, 2011.
