Project Update: August 2011

From July to August 2011 we completed all research datasets successfully. Authorities have also been informed and gave me their support to organise talks inside government buildings inviting agricultural companies from each of their administration territories. During the events a technical report in mother tongue (in preparation) is going to be given to majors and institutions representatives for free distribution. Also talks in schools are planned during this year.

We expected a change of perceptions about environment and gave a clear idea of what are really conservation strategies based on research and monitoring. I am going to give all my support on redirecting conservation plans and programmes for districts and agricultural companies. Some of these companies worked hard for exportation environmental certifications, but decisions were not the best due to lack of adequate baselines and limited accessibility to information. We are very enthusiastic to go as soon as possible for this next step.
