## Project Update: April 2012

Busy with rescues and nesting season, I will be completing my application for the next Rufford Small Grant this week to continue our research and to have collected crocodile scute samples exported to the USA for toxicity testing.

My final publishable article will follow shortly thereafter. Collecting data, rescuing crocodiles, and filming, including Discovery Channel World's "Wildlife SOS," has us busier than ever. I have been asked by The World Wildlife Foundation Poland to appear on their newest series, "Women at the End of the World," filming to start this last summer. I aim to make all of you proud.
