Project Update: July 2011

The Skills and Agricultural Development Services (SADS) formally launched the Wonegizi Youth Environmental Rights Awareness & Educational Training Program on 3rd April 2011 in Konia Town, the headquarters of Ziama Clan, Lofa County. This launching programme brought together 40 members of the Wonegizi Community Forestry Management Board, the Clan Chief and Schools administrators. The purpose of this formal launching ceremony was to officially inform and explain the project background and objectives to



representatives from the 20 communities that constitute the Ziama Clan in the present of the Clan Chief and school administrators. It also afforded SADS the opportunity to solicit the clan support throughout the implementation process. In a special statement, Mr. John Woukolo- Clan Chief, commented that "*I* am very happy for this program, most especially youth being the targeted beneficiaries. I also believed that if we invest in the minds of our kids, they will change the future and improve living standards". A couple of hours were taken to explain the various components of the program and why it is beginning as a pilot in three communities.

During the launching program, SADS also facilitated the selection process of the three communities and schools in which the Wonegizi Youth Environmental Rights Awareness & Educational Training Program will be piloted. After several suggestions and discussions, the participants agreed and selected the following communities and schools for the piloting:
