Developing the conditions for ensuring nature protecting issues in tourism development				This objective was planned to be achieved by establishment of two-way communication between NP Djerdap authorities and local communities in order to integrate them in development of ecotourism in NP Djerdap area. This was done firstly by collecting inputs from local stakeholders. We tried to choose different groups of people and talk to them about importance of nature protection. This was done during the fulfilling the questionnaires. We invited people to the upcoming meetings. We collected in total 91 questionnaires. Afterwards, we organised three meetings in three different locations in NP Djerdap. We presented data from questionnaires and organised discussion on ecotourism development with focus on nature protection, where we received many very good ideas and reflections.
Support to the local stakeholders to be involved in nature protection and ecotourism development				Within this objective we undertook preparation and dissemination of guidelines for ecotourism development which are focused on nature conservation issues and how to manage it according to ecotourism development. Also, we organised training on educational issues such as: how to prepare tourism product; how to develop additional offer in ecotourism; marketing of ecotourism, legal and institutional system regarding protected areas and ecotourism, role of local community, allowed and prohibited activities in



		protected areas.
Support to NP Djerdap to organize ecotourism offer		In order to have an ecotourism offer, NP Djerdap representatives were participating to our training and they collected inputs from local community representatives about possibilities for ecotourism offer. Also, guidelines for ecotourism development contains recommendations for NP Djerdap authorities.

2. Please explain any unforeseen difficulties that arose during the project and how these were tackled (if relevant).

There were no serious difficulties. Training was postponed for mid-September 2017, although it was originally planned to be organised by the end of August 2017.

3. Briefly describe the three most important outcomes of your project.

Outcome1: Establishment of two-way communication platform. This platform consists of members from local communities, environmental NGOs, NP Djerdap employees, owners of rural accommodations, representatives of tourism agencies and members of associations. The platform has own dynamics for consultation processes and the leaders. Platform is open for other members which join the group over the time.

Outcome 2: Organisation of training. The training was organised with participation of almost all members of communication platform (local communities, environmental NGOs, NP Djerdap employees and members of associations). Training provided much of useful information on how to prepare tourism product; how to develop additional offer in ecotourism; marketing of ecotourism, legal and institutional system regarding protected areas and ecotourism, role of local community, allowed and prohibited activities in protected areas.

Outcome 3: Development of guidelines for ecotourism operations. Guidelines contain real and useful information, advices and recommendation about ecotourism operations. Guidelines have clear focus on nature conservation issues and how to manage it according to ecotourism development – treats of over tourism etc.

4. Briefly describe the involvement of local communities and how they have benefitted from the project (if relevant).

Local communities, from one side contributed a lot to the project (by providing relevant and from the filed information about ecotourism possibilities), but from the other side, achieved to be consulted in, important for them, process of ecotourism offer development.



During the consultation process and filed work many individuals from local communities expressed great thanks for involving them in some process with NP authorities and where they have a chance to contribute.







5. Are there any plans to continue this work?

Sure, we plan to continue work on ecotourism development now when there is a communication platform and when there is an enthusiasm and support from local communities and NP Djerdap representatives.

6. How do you plan to share the results of your work with others?

Project team members are coming from different NGOs and each of them will have a chance to distribute the know-how of communication platform development and especially Guidelines for ecotourism operations. The guidelines are available at premises of NP Djerdap. Also, we were contacted by one municipality form Stara Planina (Balkan Mountains) region regarding this project and they expressed interest to support similar project in their area, in Nature Park Stara Planina.

As well, professors from University of Belgrade, Technical Faculty of Bor were happy to host us and hear about the project.

7. Timescale: Over what period was The Rufford Foundation grant used? How does this compare to the anticipated or actual length of the project?

The Rufford Foundation grant was used starting from September 2016 to September 2017. Actually, we had to prolong an organisation of training. It took place in mid-September 2017, which is total project duration of 13 months. With this prolongation there were not any negative influences on project activities, objectives and outcomes.
