They went through topics of mobilisation skills, Uganda wetland legislation, wetland conservation and management, proposal writing, business skills as well as HIV/AIDS and gender issues, as emphasised by the government. The day's session adopted instructive presentations, discussions, participatory methodologies, questions and answers approaches. The training was conducted by Patrick B.
