

Bil. 1.2 zatengeneza madawati jijini Mwanza

HALMASHAURI ya Jiji la Mwanza imetumia sh. bilioni 1.4, kutekeleza agizo la Rais Dk. John Magufuli kukabiliana na tatizo la madawati katika shule za msingi.

Akitoa taarifa ya utekezaji wa agizo hilo, juzi, kwa Mkuu wa Wilaya ya Nyamagana, Baraka Konisaga, Mkurugenzi wa Halmashauri ya jiji hilo, Adam Mgoyi alisema tayari wametengeneza na kukamilisha madawati 6,840 kutokana na kiasi hicho cha fedha walichokipata baada ya kubana matumizi.

Mgoyi alisema wamebana matumizi ya miezi mitatu Januari, Februari na Machi mwaka huu, ili kuanza utekezaji wa agizo hilo na kuhakikisha wanamaliza tatizo la upungufu wa madawati 11,400 katika shule zake 78. Ibaada ya serikali kutangaza kuanza kutoa elimu bure kutoka darasa la kwanza hadi kidato cha tano, kumejitokeza changamoto kubwa ya

wanafunzi kuongezeka katika shule za msingi na kusababisha wengi kukaa chini wakati wa masomo.

Kwa hali hiyo na agizo la msheshimiwa Rais Dk Magufuli alilolitoa nchini kote, imetlazimu kubana matumizi kwa kipindi cha miezi hiyo mitatu ili kukabiliana na changamoto ya madawati 11,400 ambayo ndiyo mahitaji ya shule zetu 78 kwa mjiwa wa tathmini iliyofanywa na wataalamu wa Jiji alisema Mgoyi.

Alisema pamoja na kukamilisha kiasi hicho ambacho ni sawa na asilimia 60, wanatarajia ifikapo mwishoni mwa mwezi Juni mwaka huu wawe wamekamili kiasi cha asilimia 40 kilichosalia (madawati 4,560).

Mgoyi alitaja changamoto nyingine iliyojitokeza katika shule hizo kuwa upungufu wa matundu ya vyoo ambayo pia wanakabiliana nayo sambamba na upungufu wa madawati na tayari wamejenga matundu 180 ya vyoo katika shule 18 za msingi kwa thamani sh. milioni 270.

Kwa upande wake, Konisaga

akipongeza hatua hiyo na kusema elimu bure imefungwa fursa ya wazazi na walezi kupeleka watoto shuleni kwa wingi na kusababisha ongezeko la upungufu wa madawati hasa wa darasa la kwanza.

Kutokana na hilo, alitoa wito kwa wananchi na wadau mbalimbali wa elimu kusaidia kuchangia ya madawati.

"Natoa ombi kwa wadau wa maendeleo katika wilaya yetu wakiwemo wananchi na wafanyabiashara kuunga mkono Halmashauri ya Jiji kwa kujitolea kuchangia fedha na vifaa vya kutengeneza madawati 4,560 yaliyosalia ili kuondoa kabisa tatizo hilo kwani elimu bure isitafasilwi kuwa inawazuia wadau, wananchi kuchangia na kuboresha miundombinu ya elimu, "alisema.

Konisaga alikipongeza Chuo cha Ufundi cha Buhongwa kinachomilikiwa na Taasisi ya Elimu ya Watu Wazima, ambacho kinatengeneza madawati hayo (ya mbaa na vyuma) kwa gharama nafuu ya sh. 109,000 kwa kila moja, chini ya uongozi wa Andrew Swai,

Akizungumza na gazeti hili jana, Mkurugenzi Mtendaji wa kampuni hiyo, Scholastika Kevela, alisema walishangaa kusikia kwenye vyombo vya habari kwamba mtumishi wake amekamatwa na TAKUKURU.

Alisema wanamtambua, Edward Nyakamwe, kama mtu aliyewahi kufanyakazi kwenye kampuni hiyo kama dereva kibaru kwa mkataba wa miezi mitatu tu na alishafukuzwa kazi siku nyingi.

Alisema hata wakati huo akifanyakazi kwa mkataba wa miezi mitatu, hakuwahi kutumwa kazi yoyote inayohusu Mamlaka ya Mapato Tanzania (TRA) kama kwenda kukamata wasioliipa kodi kwa kuwa si fani yake.

Ikiachilia mbali kwamba mtu huyu si mfanyakazi wetu ukweli ni kwamba ile kazi waliyokwenda kuifanya kule

hata kwenye rekodi ya kazi zetu haipo na wala hatuitambui huo ndio ukanjanja wenyewe, alisisitiza Kevela.

Aliipongeza TAKUKURU kwa kukamata watu wa aina hiyo ambao wamekuwa wakichafua sifa nzuri ya kampuni yake ambayo hajawahi kukumbwa na kashfa kama hizo.

Alisema kabla ya kuanza kukamata wafanyabiashara waliokwepa kodi, wafanyakazi wa kampuni hiyo walipewa mafunzo ya namna ya kuzingatia maadili na kujiepusha na vitendo vya rushwa.

Watu wetu wakiendelea kutekeleza jukumu fulani lazima wanakuwa katika sare maalum na wanakuwa wamevaa vitambulisho na wanakuwa katika kundi, haendi mmoja mmoja sasa huyo alijituma kwa kughusha kwamba ati ni mtumishi wetu," alisema.

"Hiyo kazi inayosema sisi hatujawahi kuipatana wala huyo mteja aliyemfuta hatumji hiviyo sisi hatuhusiki kabisa na mtu huyo na tunaomba wananchi na watu wengine wanofanyakazi nasisi waendelele kutuamini tufanye kazi," alisema Scholastika.

Walimu 1,200 walalamika kutopandishwa madaraja

WALIMU wapatao 1,200 katika Halmashauri ya Moshi Vijijini mkoani Kilimanjaro, hawajapandishwa madaraja kwa kipindi cha miaka miwili sasa.

Imeelezwa kuwa walimu hao wamekidhi vigezo vya kupandishwa madaraja lakini hadi sasa hawajapandishwa na tatizo hilo limekuwa sugu katika halmashauri hiyo.

Katibu wa Chama cha Walimu Tanzania (CWT) wilaya ya Moshi Vijijini, Dauson Temu, alisema hayo jana alipokuwa akizungumza na waandishi wa habari na kuoze kuwa walimu waliokuwa wamekidhi vigezo vya kupandishwa madaraja ni zaidi ya 1,500 lakini walipopandishwa ni 433.

Hata hivyo, alisema walimu hao hadi sasa hawajakabidhiwa barua zao za kupanda vyeo pamoja na kupandishwa mishahara yao.

"Nashangaa katika halmashauri yetu, imekuwa nyuma katika kupandishwa walimu vyeo na hata wale wanaopandishwa wamekuwa wakicheleweshwa barua zao pamoja

na mishahara mipya tofauti na halmashauri nyingine ambapo walimu wao wameshaanza kunufaika," alisema.

Alisema kila siku halmashauri inawaahidi kuwapandisha vyeo walimu pamoja na kuwapa barua zao lakini ahadi hiyo haitokelezi na kusababisha walimu kukata tamaa na kazi.

Temu alitomba serikali kuingilia kati suala hilo ili kumaliza tatizo linalowakabili walimu wa halmashauri hiyo.

Aidha alisema kuwa walimu wanadai zaidi ya sh. milioni 572 kutokana na malimbikizo ya mishahara, posho za uhamisho na likizo.

Katibu wa huyo alisema tatizo lingine linalowakabili walimu katika halmashauri hiyo ni kutolipwa madeni yao wanayoidai serikali tangu mwaka 2008 hadi sasa, licha ya madeni hayo kuhakikiwa.

Alisema walimu wa shule za msingi na sekondari wanadai zaidi ya sh. milioni 462 za madai ya mishahara iliyorukwa bila kulipwa kwa nyakati tofauti na sh. milioni 110 ni madai mbali mbali yanayohusiana na malipo ya likizo na uhamisho.

Wafuga nyuki Mikumi wafadhiliwa

ASASI ya kuhifadhi mazingira ya Conservation of Nature for Survival (CONASU) kwa ushirikiano na shirika la "The Ruffor Foundation-RSG" la Uingereza, imegawa mizinga ya nyuki yenye thamani ya sh. milioni 3.5, katika vijiji sita vinavyopakana na Hifadhi ya Mikumi mkoani Morogoro.

Akizungumza kwa nyakati tofauti kwenye vijiji vya Doma, Maharaka, Kihondo, Mkata, Kilangali na Palakuyo vilivyoko wilayani Kilosa na Mvomero, Mratibu wa Conas katika mradi shirikishi wa hifadhi tembo na makazi yake, Angelus Runji, alisema njia hiyo inalenga kuwalinda wanyama na hifadhi kwa kuepusha ujangili na uharibifu mazingira.

"Kuna wimbi la ujangili na uharibifu mazingira hususan katika hifadhi za taifa, hivyo kuhatarisha kutoweka

wanyama wetu kama tembo na wengine, baada ya tafiti zetu tumeamua kuja na mbadala kuwanusuru wanyama hawa bila kumwathiri mwanachi," alisema.

Runji alitaja faida za ufugaji nyuki mpakani mwa hifadhi mwa vijiji hivyo kuwa ni njia rahisi ya kuwazua wanyama hao wakiverno tembo.

Aliongeza kuwa "Hawa nyuki ni wadudu wenye ukrofu unawafanya kuwa rafiki zetu hasa sisi tulio jirani na hifadhi kwa kuwa hawapatani kabisa na wanyama pori hususan tembo, lakini hii ni shughuli yoyote muhimu mtu katika kutafuta kipato na nyuki wenyewe na zao lake la asali ni dawa kwa viembe duniani."

Muikolajia wa Hifadhi ya Mikumi, Samwel Mghochi, alisema hadi kufikia miaka ya 1980, Tanzania ilikuwa na tembo 600,000 ambapo takwimu za hivi karibuni inaonyesha kuna tembo 40,000.

Imeelezwa kuwa mfuko huo umekuwa ukiwanufaisha baadhi ya watendaji waliopo serikalini na si wakulima.

Aidha walieleza kuwa makato ya fedha wanazokatwa katika kila msimu wa mavuno ya kahawa ni makubwa ambapo fedha hizo zililenga kwa kununua dawa za kuhudumia zao hilo lakini haziwafiki walengwa.

Wanachama hao walitoa kauli hiyo

juzi kwenye mkutano mkuu uliofanyika mjini hapa na kueleza ni vyema waunde mfuko wa pembejeo za kilimo.

Walisema lengo la kuunda mfuko wa Vidung'ata ni kwa ajili ya kudhibiti wadudu wanaoshambulia mti wa kahawa hasa katika kipindi cha masika na kwamba fedha wanakatwa sh.50 kwa kila kilo moja ya kahawa.

"Tunataka mfuko huo uondolewe kwenye mfumo wa serikali, upeleke katika chama hiki cha ushirika lengo tuondokane na matatizo haya ya upatikaji wa pembejeo za kuhudumia zao letu la kahawa," alisema.

Wilson Kapinga ambaye ni mkulima wa kutoka Kata ya Ngima, alisema wamefikia umuzi huo kutokana na baadhi ya watendaji wa serikali ambao ni mabwana shamba kukosa uaminifu wa namna ya kukifika dawa kwa wakulima, ambapo huishia mikononi

mwao kwa lengo la kujitunaiisha binafisi.

Kapinga alisema maafisa ugani muda mwingi wamekuwa wanaishi mjini badala ya kuwa karibu na wakulima vijijini, kitendo kinachowafanya washindwe kuwajibika ipasavyo kwa wakulima.

Mkulima wa kahawa, Peter Komba kutoka Kata ya Myanganyanga wilayani hapa, alisema wakati umefika kwa watendaji hao kuchukuliwa hatua za kinidhamu kutokana na kutowajibika ipasavyo katika maeneo yao ya kazi.

Mwenyekiti wa chama hicho, Stanley Lupogo, aliunga mkono hoja hizo na kuongeza kuwa endapo wana malengo ya kuimarisha ushirika huo, wakulima wa kahawa wanapaswa kuzalisha zao hilo kwa wingi na ubora unaokubalika katika soko la ndani na nje ya nchi.

Woman arrested for burning her 8-year-old sister with iron

Morogoro. A 30-year-old woman has been arrested for allegedly using an iron to burn an eight-year-old girl as punishment for not performing household chores. District council to verify workers' certificates

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Morogoro. The Morogoro District Council plans to verify workers' academic certificates in the ongoing audit of the public service employee database.

Acting district council executive director Ernest Kisombi told *The Citizen* on Wednesday the move is part of the council's effort to identify ghost workers in the region.

He revealed that so far the council has identified 19 ghost workers who have caused government a loss of Sh58 million.

"In order to ensure that we don't have ghost workers, heads of departments have been directed to conduct regular verification of their subordinates' records," said Mr Kisombi.

He warned that any employee whose certificate isn't valid would face legal action.

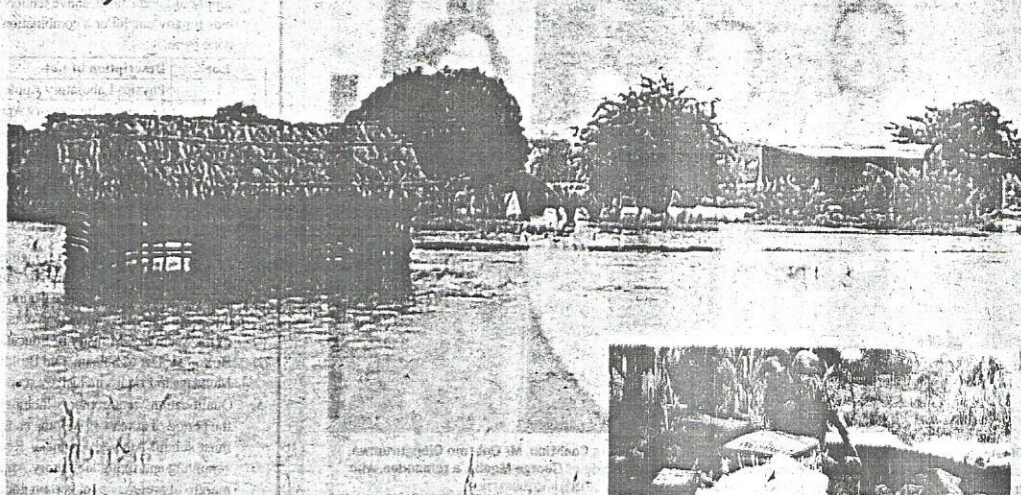
However, speaking on condition of anonymity because they are not allowed to speak to the press on government business, some of the workers said it would have been better if the verification exercise was also done to ensure each of them receives what he or she deserves.

"Some of us have worked for more than 10 years without promotion. We want this exercise to go hand in hand with resolving some of the challenges we have been facing for so long," said one of the workers.

Floods kill five, leave over 13,000 homeless in Moro

Floods sweep away a total of 315 houses in the four districts of Kilosa, Morogoro rural, Kilombero and Malinyi where 13,900 people were left homeless

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Morogoro. Five people were killed and more than 13,900 rendered homeless by floods as heavy rains pounded Morogoro yesterday.

A report released by Morogoro Regional Commissioner Steven Kebwe shows that more than 3,000 families had been affected and a total of 12,073 hectares of crops destroyed, leaving residents without food.

Dr Kebwe said the floods swept away a total of 315 houses in four districts of Kilosa, Morogoro rural, Kilombero and Malinyi.

According to Dr Kebwe, five peo-

ple were drowned in various rivers in Kilosa and Kilombero districts. Those drowned include a taxi driver, who sunk in his car.

"We are seeking humanitarian support from various stakeholders. Currently, the victims don't have

shelter, food, and drugs," he said.

He added that his office has already approved Sh10 million for purchasing food for the victims.

"We are handing over six tonnes of maize, two tonnes of beans and 400 litres of cooking oil to the Morogoro District Council. We are still seeking support for the Kilosa flood victims," he said.

The Kilombero Plantations Ltd (KPL), Tobacco Company and TTCL donated some of the basic items for the victims. "But we have also requested the Ministry of Health, Community Development, Gender, Elderly and Children, which has accepted to donate medicines. The Medical Store Department (MSD) will bring them today," said the RC.

Dr Kebwe said he has already reported the incident to the disaster management department under the Prime Minister's office.

MORE INFO: THE FLOOD DISASTER SINCE JAN

In Tanzania, flooding has been reported in five regions since mid-January, 2016. At least 400 people have been displaced in Dodoma municipality after 70 houses were destroyed or damaged after heavy rain between 17 and 18 January 2016. Since then, flooding has been reported to continue in Morogoro, Katavi, Mtwara and Dar es Salaam.

Don lashes out at 'inept' councillors

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Morogoro. Councillors are to blame for the lack of development in their areas of jurisdiction because most of them are irresponsible, a senior official with a public service training institute has said.

The Principal of the Dodoma based Local Government Training Institute, Hombolo, Dr Emmanuel Gibai, said councils were failing to perform to the expectations of their people because of bad leadership. His institution is responsible for the training of the majority of local government workers in the country.

Dr Gibai made the remarks while addressing Kilosa and Gairo districts' councillors and project coordinators of Public Sector Systems Strengthening project (PSS) during the ongoing four-day forum in Morogoro Region.

He said the majority of councils have not been performing well in supervising development projects due to conflict of interest between the councillors and executive directors.

Pia alizipongeza hoja za Freeman Mbowe na kudai ni za msingi na zimeiva kwa kutosha

kuchangamana ndani ya Ukumbi wa Bunge, lakini kitendo cha kuondoka nazo nje inaonesha ni namna gani mfumo wa uongozi ndani ya UKAWA ni wa mtu mmoja na kwamba hautoi nafasi ya watu wengine kusikilizwa.

Alisema kuwa, pia inaonesha Ukawa wana udhaifu mkubwa wa kujenga hoja kwa kutegemea mazingira na wakati kwani kwa kitendo chao cha kutoka ndani ya Bunge kwa msimamo wa kugomea hotuba ya bajeti ya Waziri Mkuu inaonesha wazi ni namna gani serikali ilikuwa sahihi kusitisha matangazo ya Bunge ya moja kwa moja.

"Kwa sababu kodi za Watanzania hazivezi kuwa zinatunika kwa kulanya vibweka

Runji ambaye pia ni Mkurugenzi wa asasi hiyo alitaja faida za ufugaji nyuki mpakani mwa hifadhi

na vijiji vyao hivyo kuwa ni njia rahisi ya kuwazuia wanyama hao wakwemo tembo kutokana na kutopatana nao, zao la asali litokanalo na nyuki lina soko kubwa ndani na nje ya nchi na ni dawa kwa viumbe vyote duniani.

Akiunga mkono juhudi hizo Muikolojia wa Hifadhi ya Mikumi, Samweli Mgohachi alibainisha kuwa mpaka miaka ya 1980 Tanzania ilikuwa na zaidi ya tembo 600,000 ambapo kwa takwimu za karibuni inaonesha ina tembo wanaokadiriwa kufika 40,000 kiasi ambacho ni kidogo ikiilinganishwa na kasi ya uwindaji haramu uliopo.

"Mbali na kuwa shukuru mazawa mazuri ya asasi kama Conasu na mengine yenye mtazamo huu pia nikipongeze kijiji hiki kwa kazi kubwa kinayofanya kuwanusuru hawa tembo, kwani ni kijiji pekee chenye sifa ya kutoa taarifa ya aina mbalimbali zinazooneshwa kuhatarisha wanyama na wananchi kwa ujumla," alisema Muikolojia Samweli.

Kwa aupande wao Mwenyekiti wa Kijiji cha Mkata wilayani Mvomero, Katheline Sebastian na Katibu wa Jumuiya ya Uhfadhi Mazingira na Wanyama Pori (KIDOMA), Daniel Gasper kwa nyakati tofauti walibainisha

changamoto zinazowakatisha tamaa ya kushirikiana na TANAPA kuwa ni kukosa kifuta jasho licha ya kazi ngumu na ya hatari wanayofanya dhidi ya majangili, wafugaji kuingiza mifugo hifadhi, wachoma mikaa na wapasua mbaao.

Hata hivyo, Katibu wa Jumuiya ya Kidoma, Gasper mbali na kubainisha kushuka kwa ari ya wanakijiji kumarisha ulinzi dhidi ya wanyama waliohatarini kutoweka akiwemo tembo, pia alisema juhudi zao za kukomesha uharibifu na ujangili unadhoofishwa na nguvu ya rushwa hasa kwa viongozi wa serikali na vyombo vya dola wilayani humo.

"Nyuki ni wadudu wakali lakini ni rafiki wa binadamu kutokana na kuwa na uwezo wa kutengeneza asali ambayo ni bidhaa muhimu kwa maisha ya wamadamu, pia eneo lenye nyuki tembo hawawezi kupita ndiyo maana tumegawa mizinga hiyo," alisema.

Foreign NGO helps community to protect elephants

MIKUMI National Park Authority has asked the community surrounding the park to support government efforts in conserving, protecting and managing elephants in the country.

Mikumi National Park Ecologist Samweli Mgochachi told a sensitization seminar conducted recently for villagers from six villages in Morogoro region.

Mgochachi said the community had an important role to play in ensuring protection and management of African elephants was successful.

"This initiative of raising awareness to villagers opens a new chapter in park-community shared objective of conserving Mikumi National Park," he said.

Organised by Conservation of Nature for Survival (CONASU) with support from the London-based The Rufford Foundation, the meeting gathered villagers from Kihondo, Maharaka, Doma and Mkata villages from Mvomero district, and Parakuyo and Kilangalal villages from Kilosa district.

Some villagers admitted that it was possible to end destructive practices which were being carried out in the park. CONASU Executive Director Angelus Runji said the sensitization meeting was one of the activities in the project to enhance the community's protection and management of African elephant habitat, which was underway in Mikumi National Park.

"We are also encouraging the community to involve themselves with some activities like beekeeping to raise their income at the same time protecting our animals," he said.

He said there was a need to have an ecological balance.

"That is why we have taught villagers to stop fire burning and charcoal making in forests in order to make beekeeping project possible," he said.

Already the organization has supplied 30 beehives worth Sh3.5million to six villages with a condition that the projects must be supervised by village authorities.

"We are sure that through enhancing community capacity, elephant habitat will be safe and secure and it will end poaching to the great extent.

Mkata village chairperson Catherine Sebastian and Secretary for Kidoma Community Conservation of Environment and Wildlife Daniel Gasper said they were facing various challenges in conserving the national park. They alleged that they were being let down by the Tanzania National Parks for not paying them anything despite the hardships they faced in dealing with poachers and pastoralists who entered the park for grazing their cattle.

Dons lay accent on competent teachers in govt schools

ACADEMICIANS have urged the government to ensure that it employs quality teachers to enable them impart required skills and knowledge to students of all levels of education.

They said teachers need also to be assessed their language knowledge in terms of speaking, reading, writing and listening before being employed to teach in public schools.

"A lecturer with the School of Education of the University of Dar es Salaam, Dr Mwajuma Vuzo, said at the just-ended Seminar on Teaching and Learning in Mother Tongue held at the institution that there is need for the government to employ competent teachers if it is to raise the standards of

education in the country.

She suggested teachers to be assessed in their respective areas of studies periodically, especially in English subjects to know their competence and improvements in their careers.

According to her, a number of students were not performing well in the subject because of lack of specialized teachers in the subject at all levels of studies.

"With good teachers, students at all levels will always perform well," she underscored, adding:

"English language has a lot of benefits, not only to the nation but also around the globe. We therefore need to ensure our students are capable of speaking the language."

Commenting on the debate, Prof Kitila Mkumbo, Department of Education Psychology and Curriculum Studies at the university said stressed the importance of ensuring that children are knows their mother tongue.

"It is very important for children to learn other languages, but a mother tongue is equally important because it identifies us"

However, he said there was need also to ensure that English language is introduced at an early stage of learning to make students gain confidence in their studies.

"English is a survival language, we need to be serious on this subject because children are poorly performing in their studies and this is

a big problem in the country," he said.

He added, "If our neighbouring countries can learn English, so we can do better."

A recent research by Twaweza East Africa on challenges children face from primary and secondary schools in the country shows at least 63 percent of parents are of the views that English should be used as a medium of instruction at all levels of studies.

The research also suggested that the key to improving the quality of primary education is to focus on teachers.

Other suggestions of the report touched on improving education in terms of follow up on teacher performance, increase teacher's salaries and number of teachers.

Ministry hosts dialogue with bankers on land loans

MINISTER for Lands, Housing and Human Settlements Development William Lukuvi has asked financiers and supporters of agriculture to ensure that loans issued to farmers are solely used to boost the agricultural sector.

He was speaking in Dar es Salaam recently at a meeting with bankers and land stakeholders.

The minister said if people invested in farming in accordance with the promotion of the sector, the country would be at a better position of sustainable development depending on agriculture.

He cautioned loan applicants

against using land title deeds as collateral for their loans and then use the money to undertake other businesses, saying farmers needed instead to ensure their farming land was properly developed for the country's economic well-being.

"Banks and other agricultural loan financiers need to make follow-ups to ensure the issued loans were mortgaged with the intended purposes," he said.

According to him, many people owned big plots which were not secured, saying more than 200,000 acres of farming land were mortgaged with banks as guarantees for loans.

"Farmers need to use their customary land certificates to process

bank loans for their farms because they are recognized by the government," he said.

Currently, 360,000 farming land certificates have been issued to farmers countrywide.

For her part, title deed registrar Subira Sinda blamed financial institutions for issuing loans to applicants without verifying the legitimacy of the land deeds submitted by the applicants.

"It is better for them to ensure that the documents are original before issuing loans, instead of only relying on security forms which have been filled by the applicants," she said.

Programme Coordinator of the

Property and Business Formalisation Programme (Mkurabita) Seraphia Mgenbe said bankers have the responsibility to building the capacity of people to utilize their land certificates to secure loans and thus improve their incomes.

"Loan beneficiaries lack enough awareness on how to utilize their loans as intended, eventually they fail to repay the loans...so they need education," she said.

Tuse Joune, acting director Tanzania Bankers Association, applauded the minister for his idea of meeting bankers for dialogue, saying the dialogue would help resolve issues before resorting to courts of law.
