## **Project Update: December 2010**

A 20-minute long educational and promotional film was made about the subterranean fauna and freshwater supplies. The film was broadcast on the local TV station 4 Rivers. Some parts of the film were shown on the national TV station in a mosaic show on three occasions. After educational workshops in October 2009 held in local primary and secondary schools, the film was distributed to the foregoing and some other schools (15 in total) and presented to pupils in September 2010. The field research data were collected and all laboratory research results were finished. A list was composed of all references and field data, which represents an important scientific basis for the proposal of the Ogulin Plaški Region as a Natura 2000 site.
