BIRD ADAPTATIONS: BEAKS






Seed Cracker

Short cone-shaped beaks that exert greatest force near their base



A hooked beak that enables meat-eating birds to pull apart animals too big to swallow






Fruit Cracker

The hook at the beak's tip is used to pull at the pulp of fruit, while the jaws near the base of the beak crack open the seeds and reach the kernels

Probing Beak

Long beaks that are used to probe inside moist ground





Curlew Forceps

Long and curved beak for digging up creatures buried deep in the mud

Underwater Sieve

The lower bill moves up and down to pump water against the top bill, where a fringe of fine slits traps the food






Dabbling Beak

Water enters the two flattened halves of the beak, and then anything suspended in it is strained and swallowed

Fishing Beak

Long, narrow beaks that are edged with teeth in order to grip the fish





Wood Chiseling Beak

Pointed beak, like a chisel, to make holes in trees to find insects

Flower Probing Beak

Thin, long, slightly curved beaks which enable birds to probe flowers for nectar
