I would like to thank Rufford Foundation for this incredible opportunity you have given me to conduct this project in Brazil and supporting all activities we initiated in 2015. The community has embraced Rufford and has used the resource to make long lasting changes in the education of the village. The students participating in the project are now the community agents that guide the population to create new habits of conservation. Along with the positive results achieved so far, new connections with government bodies and education institutes have been made. There is no doubt that all activities running in this project will soon be replicated in other communities nearby. In a recent interview with the school director Celio Ribeiro he estates: **"We are experiencing a progress in the education of our students that we have never seen before. They are happy to come to school to participate on the outdoor projects, which has positively impacted their grades along the year".** According to Mr Ribeiro, those outdoor programs are important to reduce school invasion, improve social skills among students, and facilitate the communication of environmental and social issues in the village. The financial support from Rufford Foundation and **EnviroMentor** are shaping the education system in Canaan village and serving as a model to other schools and communities. The international input of these foundations are opening doors to other institutions to give support to the project.

Project-based learning achieved

In this project, we proposed specific activities that allowed students to build their knowledge, by experiencing the issue. this year, we were able to maximise our resources and create other opportunities for the students, such as visiting the Art and Culture Centre in Fortaleza, the Federal University, and participating on a workshop of building artisanal fishing boats. These excursions happened after the school was successful in reforesting the local mangrove (*previous report*). Students were selected based on school grades, and after the excursions, they presented to the the school what they learned from the trip. "**The excursion is a great opportunity to selected students further build their knowledge in history and science, and also allow them to share what they learned with other friends in school who were not selected this time"**, says Mr Ribeiro.

Hang on, I have some more to say! The Science Club, supervised by our secondary teacher Mr. Bonifácio learned how to produce disinfectants and other cleaning products, as part of chemistry classes. Students found amazing that the same product they see in Supermarkets can actually be created in school.
