1. INTRODUCTION

Programme related activities for October are highlighted below:

1.1 Programme patrol and field activity intervention areas

The following project activity areas were patrolled and visited by field based teams in October. These are:

- Elephant Corridor Fencing Team Marania to Kisima line, Marania gate, and the Kamiti fence line
- Marania Wildlife Guards Marania forest, Chemi Chemi ya Ndovu area, Mlima Dinga, Elephant Corridor, Kimbo area, Kisima forest, Kiwanja ya Dyre, Mlima Ngaita and Daraja ya Charlie
- Horse Patrol Team (HPT) Marania forest, School of Adventure, Mlima Ngaita, River Marania, Mlima Emburi, Solo camp, Emburi area, Karoli area, Chemi chemi ya Ndovu and Kiwanja ya Dyre
- Joint Wildlife Protection Team (JWPT) Ruthumbi area and parts of immediate vicinity
- *Field Coordinator* Maara District of Tharaka Nithi County in localities bordering the Chogoria forest block on environmental education and awareness. Ontulili forest block and parts of Buuri district on aspects related to tree planting and reforestation work.

2. PROJECT UPDATES

2.1 Illegal logging

This October, cases of illegal logging were reported by the JWPT and the Marania Wildlife Guards. Logging was across species; Red cedar (*Juniperus procera*), Rosewood (*Hagenia abyssinica*), Cypress (*Cupressus lusitanica*) Camphor (*Ocotea usambarensis*) and Podo (*Podocarpus spp.*) were all affected.

2.3 Elephant mortality incidents

At least two old elephant mortality incidents were reported by Marania Wildlife Guards and the Joint Wildlife Protection Team at Chemi Chemi ya Ndovu and in Ruthumbi respectively. Details of the incident are summarized herein below:

2.4 Fence intrusion, destruction and manipulation

Although no arrests were made, several intruders were seen attempting /entering into the Elephant Corridor precincts' this October. These incidents are highlighted in bullet form below:

- On 6th October at about 1230hrs four boys found illegally harvesting grass near the underpass but they manage to escape
- On 7th October at about 1030hrs four men and one woman seen illegally harvesting grass at the lower section of the corridor but manage to escape
- On 11th October at about 1828hrs MKT fencer encounters two boys illegally harvesting grass but escape leaving behind two bags full of grass
- On 17th October at about 1730hrs MKT fencer ambushes two women and five men illegally harvesting grass at Kamiti section without success
- On 17th October at about 0912hrs six men are discovered illegally harvesting grass after damaging the fence net to gain access into the corridor compelling MKT fencer to request for reinforcement from Marania security
- On 22nd of October at about 1020hrs MKT fencer found four women illegally harvesting grass at the middle section but they manage to escape
- On 26th of October at about 1202hrs MKT fencer found six boys illegally harvesting grass at the lower section but they managed to escape leaving behind three bags of harvested grass
- On 26th of October at about 1200hrs two women caught illegally harvesting grass at the middle section but they escaped as MKT fencer approached them.

2.5 Ambushes, arrests and apprehensions

The following is a chronology of ambushes, arrests and apprehensions this October:

- Two (2) loggers, Gerald Mbaya Gitobu and Charles Kithinji Kirima were on the 12th of October arrested with six (6) Red cedar posts in the Marimba area of Ruthumbi forest. The JWPT handed them over to Nkubu police station where charges were conferred upon them OB: No. 25/12/10/2013. Team members managed to follow up on the court case which resulted in five months imprisonment or a fine of Ksh. 20,000
- On 20th of October at about 1130hrs MKT fencer Patrick Mari in the company of Kisima security managed to arrest seven women in the corridor while illegally harvesting grass. However, the women had to be set free due to a lack of motorable transport to the police station
- On 20th October at about 1217hrs, the JWPT in the company of KFS rangers managed to arrest Joseph Muriithi and Cyrus Kwiriga in possession of four (4) Red cedar posts and four Suni carcasses. The suspects were taken to Nkubu police station and booked under OB: No. 49/22/10/2013
- On 29th of October at about 1820hrs fencer Patrick Mari and Kisima security arrested one man - Amos Kirinya in possession of two bags of grass illegally harvested from



Kamiti corridor, a lack of motorable transport to the police station resulted in his release.

2.6 Illegal charcoal kilns, grazing, fuelwood and bhang (Canabis sativa) plantations

Illegal charcoal kilns, illegal grazing, illegal fuel wood and firewood collection as well as bhang plantations were unearthed by the Marania Wildlife Guards and the Joint Wildlife Protection Team as depicted in the table below:

2.7 Habitat destruction by elephants

As with preceding months, elephants were reported to have destroyed a number of trees on several occasions. These incidents are tabulated below:

2.8 Observations of Lion prints in the lower Corridor

Following routine surveillance of the Corridor fence perimeter on 26th of October at about 0715hrs fencer Robert Murega came across lion (*Panthera leo*) footprints at the lower Corridor next to elephant gap. This was the first time the sighting has been made and is suspected to have come from Lewa Wildlife Conservancy through Ngare Ndare forest.

2.9 Environmental education and awareness

This month's environmental education initiatives were implemented in Maara District of Tharaka Nithi County in localities within the immediate vicinity of the Chogoria forest block. The area is dominated by mixed crop farmers but generally several human activities are ongoing within the forest both legal and illegal. Cases of human wildlife conflict are also prevalent in the area due to



absence of an electric fence perimeter. These initiatives were implemented in collaboration with

KWS Chogoria sector warden and the KWS Mt. Kenya education warden. The objective this month was to sensitize community members and school pupils on the dangers of forest destruction and consumption of game meat. This information was conveyed to audiences through the short documentary film '*Running Dry*' that clearly shows how Kenya's water catchment forests on Mount Kenya, Aberdares and the Mau complex were destroyed in the late 1980's to early 2000's. The occasions also served as an opportunity to convey to pupils the National Governments' initiative to secure the



Mount Kenya forest protected area ecosystem with an electric fence in order to safeguard it from further destruction and also guarantee continued supply of ecosystem services to succeeding generations. A three (3) day outreach exercise was able to reach eight (8) learning institutions namely; Mutindwa Primary School, Mutindwa Day Secondary School, Chief Mbogori Girls' Secondary School, Makuri Girls' Secondary School, Gantaraki Academy, Gitare Primary School, Kianjagi Day Secondary School, and Chogoria Teachers College. In total, about 2,300 pupils were sensitized with message and during an interactive question and answer session with the pupils; it was impressed upon them to pass the message to their parents and guardians.

2.10 Tree planting and reforestation

October marked the onset of the short rainy season and planting of seedlings is set to begin early



November. Tree seedlings procured from the three women groups' supported by MKT next to the Ontulili Forest Block are ready for collection and transportation to the planting site in Karuri. The key species to be planted this season are; *Juniperus procera, Olea africana* and the *Podocarpus falcatus*. Other seedlings will be procured and planted as advised by the resident KFS officer.

Efforts by the Trust and its partners also received a boost following a visit to the Kianjogu Mwanzo Mwema Women group by the District Commissioner - Buuri District. This

was a very good sign of support from the National Government towards community groups actively engaged in conservation and reforestation activities. The DC promised to support group members in their quest to improve their livelihood through dairy cattle farming. He said the National Government had recently availed a funding facility for women and youth groups and would facilitate funding for the women group should a proposal reach his office.
